Chinmayee, a caregiver, found herself in a deeply challenging phase of life. Her father-in-law, Dibakar Das, an elderly man battling stage 4 urinary bladder cancer, was undergoing intensive chemotherapy and radiation. The treatment had taken a toll on him—he was severely weak, emotionally unstable, and often confused, with episodes of disoriented speech and loss of bladder control. His behavior, such as urinating in the room, roaming at night, and engaging in irrational arguments, created a worrying environment among his family members and added to Chinmayee’s emotional burden.

As a single woman managing multiple responsibilities, Chinmayee was overwhelmed. The stress of caregiving, coupled with the emotional strain of witnessing her father-in-law’s suffering, left her anxious and exhausted. She felt isolated, unsure of how to cope with the situation.

With the support of the Apna Ghar team, Chinmayee found relief from the logistical challenges that had once consumed her—free accommodation, warm and nutritious meals, and transportation to and from the hospital were provided, allowing her to focus entirely on caregiving. But Apna Ghar offered more than just physical support—it became a space of emotional healing.

During counselling sessions, Chinmayee was encouraged to share her anxieties and fears. She was reassured that such behavioral changes in elderly cancer patients are not uncommon, especially during aggressive treatment phase. The team helped her understand that this was a temporary phase and guided her to approach caregiving with patience and empathy. She also realized the importance of shared family responsibilities—while she cared for her father-in-law, her husband had an equal role in supporting their children and his mother.

This emotional support empowered Chinmayee to care for her father-in-law with renewed strength and compassion. What once felt like an unbearable burden slowly transformed into a journey of resilience and hope.

Chinmayee expressed heartfelt gratitude to Apna Ghar for being **a pillar of support** during one of the most difficult times in her life. The safe and nurturing environment not only helped her father-in-law receive dignified care but also gave her the courage to continue her caregiving journey with grace.

In their community, women were expected to manage all household responsibilities, even during illness. Bhawanji, like many others, had never imagined stepping into a caregiving role.

Apna Ghar was not just a place for treatment but also a space for transformation. During one of the counselling sessions, a simple yet powerful message from the counsellor struck a chord with Bhawanji: “A cancer patient needs their family’s moral support now more than ever.” These words planted the seed of change. For the first time, Bhawanji saw his role not as a bystander, but as an active participant in his wife’s healing journey.

What followed was nothing short of remarkable. Bhawanji, who had never engaged in household chores, began caring for Savitaben with deep love and devotion. He cooked meals tailored to her recovery, washed her clothes, maintained her hygiene, and stood by her side as a constant emotional support. His transformation was not just in actions—it was in attitude, empathy, and understanding.

As days passed, the bond between Savitaben and Bhawanji grew stronger. The emotional support she received uplifted

her spirit, and her physical health began to show signs of improvement. The couple therapy sessions at Apna Ghar helped them reconnect, not just as husband and wife, but as partners in resilience.

Apna Ghar provided them with everything they needed—nutritious food to aid recovery, a safe and comfortable shelter, reliable transportation to and from the hospital, and most importantly, emotional care that addressed the unspoken struggles of both patient and caregiver.

This holistic support not only eased their financial burden but also brought peace to their hearts. Bhawanji’s journey from helplessness to heartfelt caregiving is a testament to the power of compassion and the impact of emotional healing. Savitaben, supported by her husband’s unwavering love and Apna Ghar’s nurturing environment, found strength in her fight against cancer.

Their story is a shining example of how care, when extended beyond medicine, can heal wounds that are invisible to the eye. Apna Ghar didn’t just support a patient, it **empowered a family**.

In 2023, Puspanjali Biswal's life took a difficult turn. She discovered a lump in her breast, and around the same time, her husband met with a serious road accident that left him unable to work. With no source of income and a young daughter to care for, the family faced a deep crisis. Puspanjali feared the high costs of hospital visits, surgeries, and tests, unaware that cancer treatments are also covered under government health schemes. This fear led her to delay seeking medical help.

Eventually, she borrowed money from a self-help group she was member of and visited a hospital in Cuttack, where doctors diagnosed her with stage-II breast cancer. She underwent surgery on both breasts and completed six chemotherapy cycles. Sadly, her body didn't respond well, and the cancer progressed to stage-IV. She was referred to a specialized cancer hospital in Cuttack, where she received 14 more chemotherapy sessions, which helped stabilize her condition. Doctors then recommended additional 25 radiotherapy sessions.

At this critical juncture, her doctor introduced her to the Apna Ghar Program by Intas Foundation. Puspanjali had been considering discontinuing her treatment due to the overwhelming costs of travel, food, and accommodation. Her husband's poor health and unemployment added to the burden, and caring for her 4-year-old daughter made things even harder.

Apna Ghar brought a turning point in her journey. Puspanjali and her family received free accommodation, nutritious meals, and transport support to the hospital, significantly easing their financial stress. Apna Ghar also provided emotional and informational support by a professional counselor who guided her through government schemes like the Biju Swasthya Kalyan Yojana, which covers up to ₹10 lakhs for treatment in private hospitals, and the State Relief Fund. This knowledge empowered her to continue treatment without fear of financial ruin. The counselor also provided emotional encouragement, sharing stories of other cancer survivors who fought bravely and recovered.

Today, Puspanjali is continuing her treatment with unwavering dedication. Though radiotherapy sometimes leaves her feeling weak, she remains determined for herself and for her daughter. With the support of Apna Ghar, she has been able to access timely treatment, stay strong emotionally, and fight cancer with dignity.

"I am very thankful to Apna Ghar. Because of their free stay, food, and guidance, I could continue my treatment. They gave me courage and hope." - Puspanjali shared.

Puja Das, a single mother from Bongaon in North 24 Parganas, is facing an incredibly difficult journey. Her three-year-old son, Arnab, has been diagnosed with eye cancer in both eyes and is currently undergoing chemotherapy in Kolkata. His condition is critical as he has completely lost his vision and is unable to open his eyes. The treatment is long, painful, and financially demanding.

Coming from an extremely poor socio-economic background, Puja struggled to manage the daily travel from Bongaon to Kolkata and find a place to stay near the hospital. The constant expenses for transportation, temporary accommodation, and medicines pushed the family into deep financial distress. She had to rely on community donations and even collect money on the streets to survive. Despite her relentless efforts, the burden of ensuring her son's treatment while managing basic needs became too heavy to carry alone.

In this moment of despair, a doctor referred her to Apna Ghar, a transit home supported by Intas Foundation. When Puja reached out, she and her son were welcomed with compassion and care. At Apna Ghar, they received free accommodation, nutritious meals, and a safe, hygienic environment close to the hospital.

Apna Ghar Program is designed with a clear purpose to reduce or eliminate out-of-pocket non-medical expenses for patients

and their caregivers. For families like Puja's, this support is life-changing. By removing the financial burden of food, shelter, and travel, Apna Ghar allowed Puja to focus entirely on her son's treatment without the constant worry of how to afford the next day.

Apna Ghar offered more than just physical support. It gave Puja something she had not felt in a long time- emotional comfort. As a mother, she had been carrying the weight of fear, exhaustion, and helplessness alone. At Apna Ghar, she found people who cared for her too. She felt seen, supported, and nurtured. Sometimes, even a mother needs someone to care for her, and Apna Ghar became that place of strength and reassurance.

"Apna Ghar gave us hope when we had nothing left. During my son's cancer treatment, they provided shelter, food, and care like family. Thank you," Puja shared.

With the support from Apna Ghar, Arnab's chemotherapy has continued without interruption. The transit home has played a crucial role in ensuring continuity of care, improving the child's overall well-being, and giving the family a sense of stability during this difficult time. While there has not yet been significant improvement in Arnab's condition, Puja remains hopeful that her son will recover after completing the treatment.

When Sarita Ben Vasava was diagnosed with cancer, her life changed in an instant. Although the diagnosis was at an early stage, the fear and anxiety that followed were overwhelming. Her husband, Gimiliya Bhai, watched her struggle emotionally and physically. She lost her appetite, became restless, and the constant worry began to affect her health even more.

Coming from a poor and underprivileged background, the couple faced many challenges. They traveled from Vyara to Surat's Bharat Cancer Hospital, where the doctor confirmed the urgent need of surgery, followed by radiation therapy. Each hospital visit was exhausting. Long distances, unfamiliar surroundings, and the difficulty of arranging proper meals made the journey even harder. Gimiliya wanted to support his wife, but he did not know how to comfort her. Her fear of cancer was affecting her treatment, and he felt helpless.

At this difficult time, a relative told them about Apna Ghar. One phone call brought a vehicle to take them to the facility, and from the moment they arrived, they felt a sense of relief.

Apna Ghar provided more than just a place to stay. It became a safe and caring environment where Sarita and Gimiliya could focus on healing. Nutritious meals were served every morning, afternoon, and evening, helping Sarita regain her strength. Transportation to and from the hospital was arranged with ease, which lifted a huge burden from Gimiliya's shoulders.

The clean and cozy rooms gave them peace of mind, and the staff treated them with kindness and respect.

Gimiliya saw a change in Sarita. Surrounded by supportive people and relieved of the stress of daily logistics, she began to recover not only physically but emotionally. Her strength slowly returned, and hope began to grow in their hearts.

Gimiliya expressed his gratitude with heartfelt words - ***"We are deeply thankful to INTAS Foundation for providing safe accommodation, transport, and emotional support. Their care made our treatment journey in Surat much easier and filled with hope."***

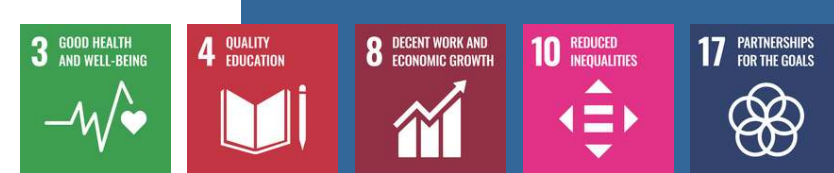

Paul, a videographer and photo designer from Avadi village, has spent years capturing life's most precious moments. His work demands long hour standing for 8 to 10 hours during events and sitting for 4 to 5 hours in his studio editing photos. But behind the lens, Paul fights a silent battle with Hemophilia.

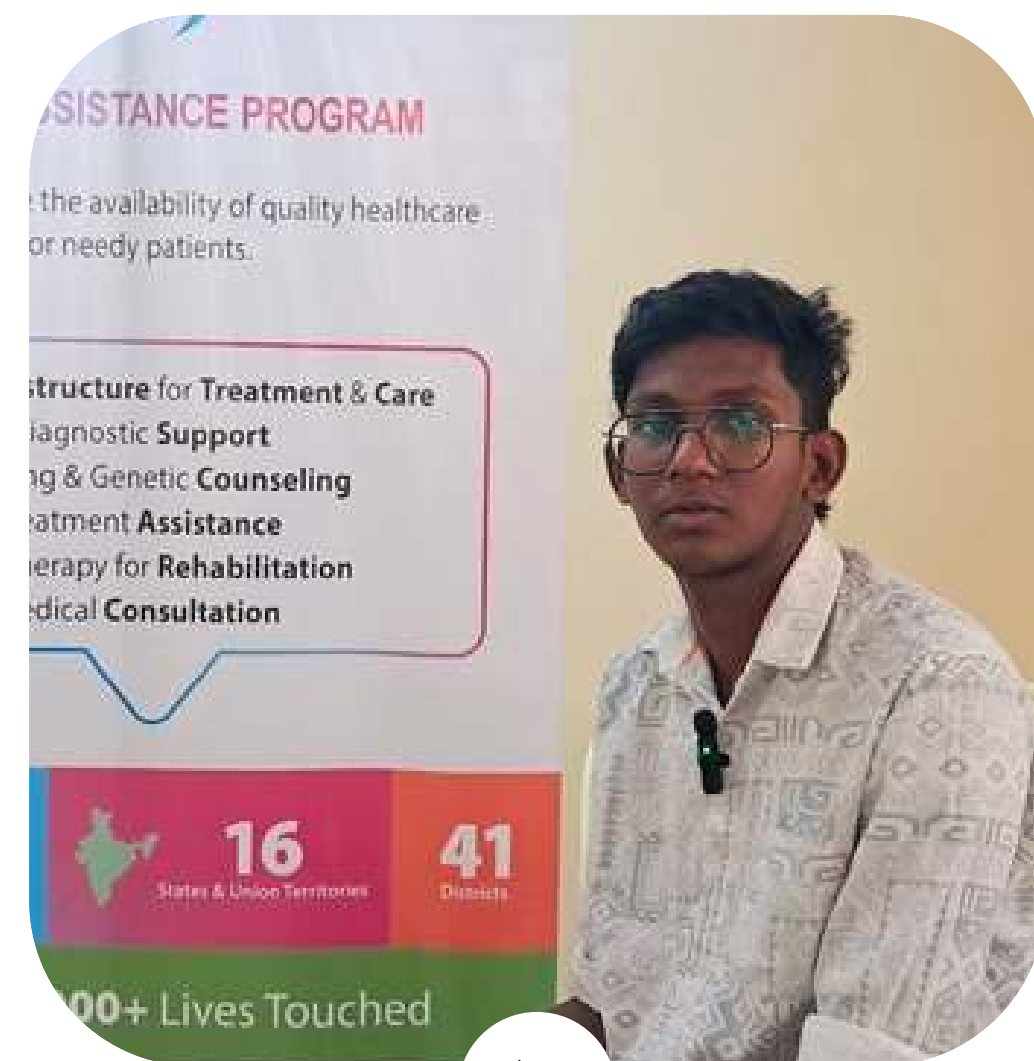
The strain of prolonged standing and sitting often triggers internal bleeding in his elbow and knee joints. Each episode means rushing to a government hospital or the local Hemophilia Chapter Society for factor support, a process filled with uncertainty and delays. Emergencies were his worst nightmare.

Paul's struggle began early. At just five years old, a schoolmate's blow to his head led to a severe headache and unconsciousness. He slipped into coma for 48 days and was admitted to a hospital in Chennai. Scans revealed a blood clot in his brain, and surgery seemed inevitable. But a senior doctor, aware of the risks, decided against it. Instead, Paul received Baxter Factor VIII injections for several days. It took six months of treatment for him to recover, a journey marked by resilience and hope.

For years, Paul lived with the fear of not finding Factor vials during emergencies. Every bleed meant pain, anxiety, and financial strain. But things changed when he connected with Intas Foundation's Hemophilia Patient Assistance Program. Through this initiative, Paul now receives timely factor support,

physiotherapy guidance, and counseling. The program has empowered him to manage his condition better, reducing the stress of unpredictable emergencies.

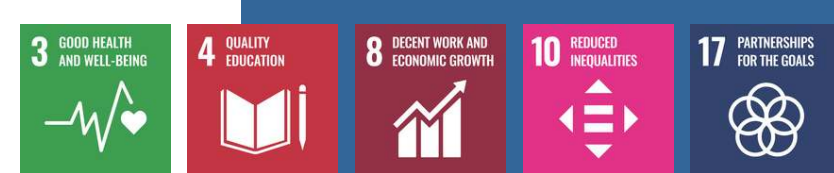

Hemophilia Patient Assistance Program

Zeeshan was just one year old when his parents first discovered he had Hemophilia A. Born in 2000, his diagnosis came in 2001—too late to prevent a severe internal bleed in his brain. That early episode left a lasting impact on his mental health and physical development, making him appear different from other children his age.

His mother recalls the pain vividly. ***“We didn’t know what Hemophilia was. By the time we understood, it was too late. There were no medicines easily available, and buying Factor VIII was a huge financial burden for a middle-class family like ours. We were exhausted—emotionally, mentally, and financially.”***

For the past 24 years, Zeeshan has been undergoing treatment, yet he continues to suffer from recurring brain bleeds. Despite the challenges, his family never gave up. Over time, support from civil society organizations like Intas Foundation helped them access treatment more easily.

During a recent phase of treatment, Zeeshan received **free Factor VIII vials to be taken home under H-PAP**, allowing his family to respond quickly to emergency bleeds without worrying about costs or availability.

His caregiver shared, ***“The factors provided by Intas Foundation suit him well. We’ve seen a noticeable improvement in his condition. The free Factor Assay test also helps us monitor his factor levels, which is crucial for planning future treatment.”***

Zeeshan’s mother now actively encourages other parents to test newborns for Hemophilia early, hoping to prevent the suffering her family endured.

Satyaprakash Kaushik, a 28-year-old from Bilaspur, Chhattisgarh, has lived with the invisible burden of Haemophilia-A, a rare bleeding disorder caused by a deficiency of clotting Factor VIII. His condition remained undiagnosed—until a head injury at the age of three led to extensive medical evaluations and a life-altering diagnosis.

Despite knowing his condition, Satyaprakash faced a harsh reality: lack of awareness, access, and affordability. In 2016, a serious accident permanently damaged the fingers of his left hand. It was then that doctors introduced him to Factor VIII therapy—a treatment that could have changed his life much earlier. But with no local access, he was forced to travel to Mumbai frequently, enduring financial strain and logistical hurdles just to obtain the life-saving vials.

Through H-PAP camps, Satyaprakash received - Free Factor VIII vials during emergencies, Physiotherapy sessions and a physiotherapy kit to improve mobility, self-infusion training, empowering him to manage his condition independently.

This support transformed his life. No longer dependent on distant hospitals or costly travel, Satyaprakash gained freedom, confidence, and control over his health. His bleeding episodes reduced, his mobility improved, and most importantly, he felt seen and supported.

He says, "Intas Foundation didn't just give me treatment—it gave me independence. I can now manage my condition without fear."

Today, Satyaprakash stands as a symbol of resilience and empowerment. His journey reflects the profound impact of accessible healthcare and compassionate support. Intas Foundation's H-PAP didn't just treat a disorder, it restored a life.

Rajesh, 42, from Chittoor district, lives with Hemophilia A Factor VIII deficiency, with less than 1% clotting factor in his blood. His condition causes frequent spontaneous internal joint bleeding and has led to joint contractures, making everyday life a challenge.

Last year, Rajesh met with a serious bike accident that left his leg severely injured and bleeding profusely. Fortunately, Rajesh had received self-infusion training during Intas Foundation's Self Infusion camp, which enabled him to immediately administer 500 IU Factor VIII injection. This prompt action helped stabilize his condition and prevented further complications before he could reach the hospital.

Rajesh was rushed to the hospital and after 10 hours, he underwent a surgery. The doctors were surprised at his rapid recovery and asked if he had taken any medication. Rajesh shared that he had used Intas Foundation's Factor VIII vials, which had helped him manage the bleeding before reaching the hospital. During the surgery, an additional 2000 IU of Factor VIII were used.

Today, Rajesh is able to walk like any other person, and he wholeheartedly credits the INTAS Foundation for this remarkable recovery. He expressed deep gratitude to Intas

Foundation for the consistent support through free factor distribution camps, physiotherapy sessions, lab support, and self-infusion training. These services have not only helped him during emergencies but have also empowered him to manage his condition with greater confidence and dignity.

"I want to thank Intas Foundation from the bottom of my heart. These services are not just helping me but also many other hemophilia patients like me. I request INTAS Foundation to continue conducting more such camps. They are truly life-saving." - Rajesh expressed.

Lalngamba Huidrom, a one-year-old child from a remote village in Manipur, has been living with Hemophilia A, a rare and serious bleeding disorder. For his parents, managing this condition has been a constant struggle. Limited awareness, high costs of treatment, and the absence of nearby medical facilities made it extremely difficult to ensure timely care. The emotional and financial stress of caring for a child with hemophilia in such a geographically isolated area was overwhelming.

The turning point came when Lalngamba suffered uncontrollable bleeding from a minor mouth injury while playing at home. His family, desperate and frightened, rushed him to the Hospital, only to discover that there was no Factor VIII stock available locally. In that critical moment, the swift coordination by Intas Foundation ensured that urgent factor support was delivered just in time. This timely intervention saved Lalngamba's life, proving that quick action can make all the difference for hemophilia patients.

Beyond this emergency, the Hemophilia Patient Assistance Program (H-PAP) by Intas Foundation has continued to support Lalngamba and his family. Through regular factor assistance, physiotherapy, caregiver counseling, and self-infusion guidance, the program has helped ease their financial burden and ensured uninterrupted care. The family now feels

more confident and supported in managing Lalngamba's condition.

Living in a remote region, where such support is rarely available, the assistance from Intas Foundation has been nothing short of a lifeline. Today, Lalngamba's bleeding is under control, and his family feels hopeful about his future. They have gained the strength to face hemophilia with resilience, knowing they are not alone.

The support from Intas Foundation has not only saved a life but also restored a family's faith in care, compassion, and community.

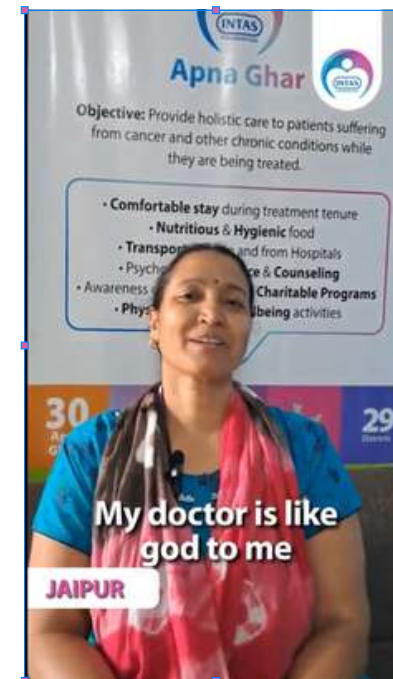
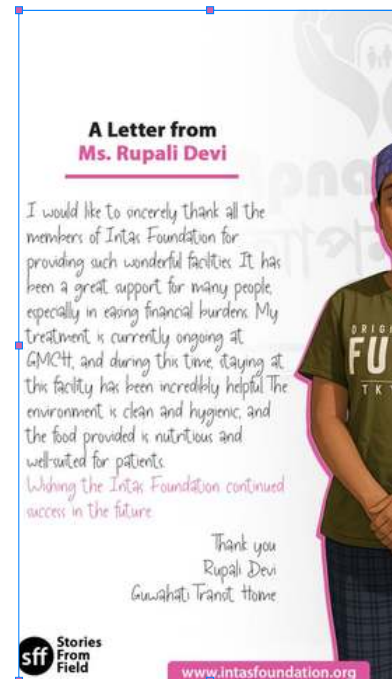
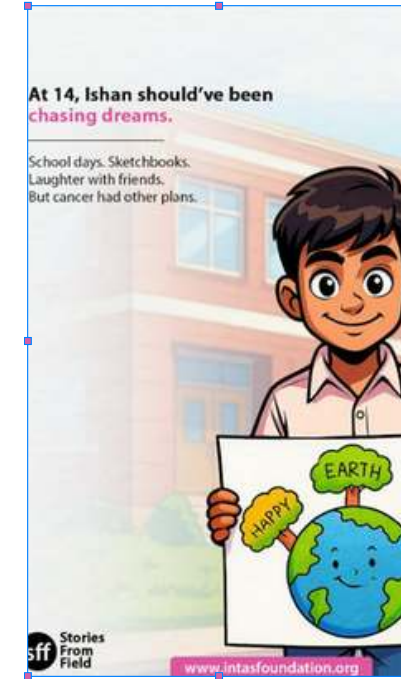
